4 = Yellow	8 = Black



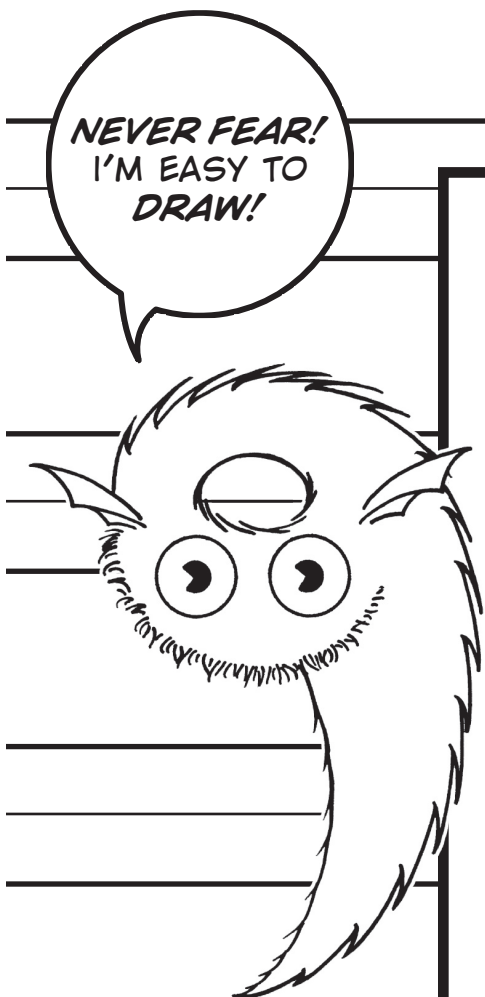
